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Throw Stones and Injure Workmen In the Cambridge Subway.

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., April 1.—Five hundred laborers who have been working on the Harvard Square end of the Cambridge subway refused to go back to work when the whistle blew at 1 o'clock to-day and announced that they were out on strike.

The men demand a nine-hour day and a \$2-a-day wage. They have been working ten hours for \$1.95, of which they are obliged to spend 5 cents for insurance. During the afternoon the strikers visited every portion of the subway route in Cambridge and used every effort to persuade the remaining laborers to quit. Practically all of the original strikers are Italians. They threw stones and pieces of planking into the excavations and a number of workmen were injured, but none seriously.

Before night two-thirds of the workmen had left and the work was practically tied up.
